Back at it: With just one day off, the Bears return to the field on Tuesday, March 6, to face Georgia State at 2 p.m. The doubleheader wraps up Mercer's eight-game homestand.

The Panthers (12-9): Nichole Griffin leads the Panthers offensively with a .426 batting average. The sophomore has hit 10 doubles and five home runs this season with 23 RBIs. Madi Gore leads GSU in the circle with a 7-2 record and a 2.22 ERA. Gore has struck out 50 batters in 53.2 innings of work and has allowed just 17 earned runs this season.

The Bears and Panthers have faced three common opponents this season,

Furman, Army and Florida A&M. Mercer fell to Furman, 15-7, while Georgia State has beaten them on three different occasions. The Panthers defeated Army, 12-0, in the Panther Invitational and Mercer split with them, 4-5 and 17-8, in the same tournament. GSU took a 6-1 win over Florida A&M at the Buzz Classic in Woodstock, Ga., and Mercer split with the Lady Rattlers, 3-4 and 7-6, earlier this season. Georgia State has also faced two Atlantic Sun Conference members, falling to Kennesaw State 2-0 and 6-0 and defeating ETSU 11-1.

Georgia State traveled to Macon for a doubleheader last season in April, defeating the Bears 3-1 and 9-4. Jamie Madruga led Mercer in the two games, going 3-for-5 at the plate with a home run and three RBIs. Jackie Jaegle went 4-for-7 for the Panthers with a double and a RBI.

The Coach: In the 20 years Bob Heck has been at Georgia State, he has led them to a 547-488-2 record. Last season, Heck's Panthers won the Colonial Athletic Association regular-season championship title, finishing 29-28 overall and 15-6 in the CAA, and Heck was named the Coach of the Year. During his time at GSU, Heck has garnered three Coach of the Year awards and has had four 40+ win seasons. Georgia State has won five conference championships during Heck's reign and has played in 11 conference championship title games.

Earlier This Season: The Bears and Panthers met in February at the Panther Invitational hosted by GSU. Mercer fell, 11-1, in the contest. Jamie Madruga scored Mercer's only run of the game with a solo shot over the right field fence in the first inning. The Panthers wasted no time getting into the game and ended up scoring 11 runs over the next five innings and the game ended due to the eight-run rule.

Conference Leaders: As a team, Mercer is tied for second in the A-Sun in team batting average at .297. Junior Jamie Madruga is sixth in the league in individual batting average with a .436 average and Kelley Bretscher (.414) ranks ninth in the same category. Madruga is also second in slugging percentage (.846) and tied for fourth with 14 RBIs. Freshman Holly Oglesbee is tied for fourth with 12 runs scored and Bretscher (10) is tied for eighth in the same category. C.J. Martin is second in walks (12) and on-base percentage (.550). Pitcher April Cunningham ranks in three pitching categories: tied for third in appearances (nine), seventh in strikeouts (26) and tenth in innings pitched (33.2).

Perfection: Junior Jamie Madruga was a perfect 5-for-5 in Sunday's doubleheader against Savannah State. Madruga started things off in her first at-bat of the day with a grand slam over the center field fence. She went on to knock two doubles and record eight RBIs for the day. Madruga leads the team offensively with a .500 batting average.

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer career record books for games started and is 44 starts away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started in 13 games this season. Bretscher took over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229.

Junior Jamie Madruga is currently fifth in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs, just six short of the fourth place spot held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03). Madruga has

already belted five homers this season, needing just one more to tie for the fourth-place spot and two to have sole possession of it.

Stiff Competition: In the latest ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, two of the Bears' opponents are ranked in the top 25 and one received votes. Alabama ranks the highest at third. Georgia holds 23rd place and N.C. State received votes.

Preseason All-Atlantic Sun: After earning All-Atlantic Sun First Team honors last season, junior first baseman Jamie Madruga was selected to the 2007 All-Atlantic Sun Preseason Team. The native of Warner Robins, Ga., finished the 2006 season ranked fourth in slugging percentage (.613) and sixth in batting average (.348) in the league.

Ranking Fourth: The Mercer softball team was picked to finish fourth in the Atlantic Sun Conference in the league's pre-season poll voted upon by the coaches. Stetson received six first-place votes and 95 points to earn the first-place spot with Kennesaw State close behind with 93 points. Stetson, the defending regular-season champions, is also favored to win the tournament championship, which will be played on its home field May 10-12. Campbell earned 69 points for third place and the Bears finished one point behind the Camels to take fourth place. Behind Mercer were North Florida and ETSU in fifth and sixth with Gardner-Webb, Jacksonville, Lipscomb and Belmont rounding out the poll.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
