Regular-Season Finale: The Bears wrap up their regular season with a single game at Georgia Tech today. First pitch is slated for 1 p.m.

The Jackets (49-13): Georgia Tech enters today's contest on a 15-game winning streak, with their last loss coming against Florida State on April 7. The Jackets have a 14-6 mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference and rank third in the league behind Virginia Tech and N.C. State.

As a team, Georgia Tech is leading the ACC in batting average, hitting .330. The average is also good for fifth in the NCAA. Caitlin Lever is the offensive cat-

alyst for the Jackets, hitting .462 with 19 doubles, 10 home runs and 57 RBIs. The two-time All-ACC selection ranks 10th in the NCAA in batting average. Five Jackets are averaging over .300. Whitney Haller leads the pack with a .395 average and ranks 10th in the nation with 60 RBIs.

Georgia Tech's pitchers have a strong presence in the circle with an average ERA of 2.58. Tiffany Johnson leads the team with a 2.46 ERA and a 16-6 record. The sophomore transfer from Florida A&M tops the team with 166 strikeouts and has held her opponents to a team-best .199 batting average. Whitney Humphreys follows close behind with a 2.69 and leads the team with 21 wins.

The Coach: Sharon Perkins is in her first season with the Jackets after spending six seasons at Georgia, two of those as the associate head coach. In six seasons at Georgia, Perkins helped build a strong program that was ranked in the Top 10 the last four years. The team made five straight NCAA appearances, including a Super Regional berth in 2005, won two Southeastern Conference titles and posted a 313-104 record. Perkins has twice been part of a coaching staff that was honored as the National Fastpitch Coaches' Association (NFCA) regional coaching staff of the year, at Southern Mississippi in 1999 and at Georgia in 2003.

Last Outing: The Bears had last week off after having a solid week of play in the A-Sun, splitting all three of their doubleheaders. Mercer started the week with a split against league-leader Kennesaw State, falling in the first game, 7-1, and taking the second game, 3-1. The Bears then traveled to Johnson City and took game one against the Bucs, 4-3, to clinch their berth to the conference tournament, but fell in the second game, 8-0. Mercer wrapped up its conference schedule at Gardner-Webb on a high note, defeating the Bulldogs in the first game, 4-2, and dropping a 3-2 decision in game two.

Conference Leaders: Junior Jamie Madruga is ranked second overall in the league with a .384 batting average and ranks in the top 10 in nine other categories: first in slugging percentage (.748), tied for first in home runs (14), second in on-base percentage (.474) and total bases (119), tied for second in doubles (16), fourth in runs scored (42), fifth in walks (27), tied for seventh in RBIs (41), and tied for ninth in hits (61).

Kelley Bretscher is tied for first in the A-Sun with 20 sacrifice hits and C.J. Martin is eighth with 25 walks. Freshman Jena Ellis is tied for ninth in the league with 14 stolen bases. Stephanie Rossman holds seventh place in strikeouts with 114.

Note: Through games as of May 4.

National Numbers: Through games as of April 22, two Bears rank nationally. Jamie Madruga is 36th in the NCAA in slugging percentage (.748) and Kelley Bretscher ranks 17th in sacrifice hits per game (.36).

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer record books for games started and is just one start away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started 56 this season. Bretscher took over sec-

ond place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229. C.J. Martin and Kristin Talamantes are tied for third in the same category with 204 starts. Bretscher also moved into fourth place for runs scored, now totaling 103 in her career. Third place is held by Stacy Nagel (2000-03) with 104 runs scored.

Junior Jamie Madruga holds third place in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted 14 home runs this season. Meghan Clark (2003-05) holds second place with 38 home runs. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already knocked in 41 runs this season. The third-place spot is held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03) with 108 RBIs. Madruga is just two doubles away from taking over the second-place spot for doubles. She currently has 31 career doubles and is looking to pass Meghan Clark (2003-05), who has 33 doubles.

Senior Stephanie Rossman took over second place in the record book for strikeouts a couple of weeks ago. Rossman has now retired 269 batters in her career and leads the team this season. First place is held by Katie Rosentreter (2003-06) with 722 strikeouts.

Stiff Competition: The Bears have faced two nationally ranked opponents this season, falling to No. 25 N.C. State, 1-0, at the USF adidas Invitational earlier this season, and dropping a 9-0 decision to No. 2 Alabama earlier this week.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
