Heading Out West: The Bears travel to Sacramento, Calif., to take part in the Capital Classic March 16-17. Mercer is set to take on Colorado State, Iowa, Santa Clara, Iowa State and Brigham Young during the two-day tournament. On Monday, March 19, the Bears compete in a doubleheader at San Jose State to end their 14-game road game trip.

The Cyclones (10-18): Iowa State faces Sacramento State and Colorado State in doubleheaders before participating in the Capital Classic. Freshman Alex

Johnson leads the Cyclones at the plate with a .333 average with four home runs and 16 RBIs. Charissa Carlin has appeared in 17 games for ISU, holding a 6-4 record in the circle with a 2.46 ERA. The Cyclones finished 23-28 in their 2006 season with a 5-13 record in the Big 12.

The Cougars (12-8): Jennifer Whiteley leads Brigham Young offensively. The senior goes into the tournament with a .482 batting average with 27 hits in 56 at-bats. Christina Gwyn is the Cougars' ace, holding a 7-4 record with a 3.15 ERA. Gwyn has struck out 55 batters in 14 appearances. BYU finished second in the Mountain West last season with a 43-22 overall record and a 15-5 league record.

The Hawkeyes (14-10): Iowa faces Colorado State in a doubleheader in Sacramento, Calif., before taking part in the Capital Classic. The Hawkeyes have faced two Atlantic Sun members, Stetson and Gardner-Webb. Iowa split in its games against Stetson, dropping a 5-2 decision in the first game and winning 4-1 in the second. Emily Nichols leads the Hawkeyes offensively, batting .500 with six home runs and 24 RBIs. Stephanie Ackerson holds a 7-4 record in the circle with a 1.65 ERA. The junior has struck out 55 batters and given up just 15 earned runs in 63.2 innings pitched. The Hawkeyes finished their 2006 campaign with a 39-22 overall record, while going 12-7 in the Big Ten.

The Rams (14-11): Colorado State is set to take on Iowa and Iowa State in Sacramento before participating in the Capital Classic. Allison Majam leads the Rams with a .407 batting average. Majam has knocked six doubles, three home runs and nine RBIs. Kim Klabough holds a 2.40 ERA to lead the Rams, appearing in 15 games with a 5-4 record. CSU finished with a 26-25 record overall last season, with a 6-14 record in the Mountain West.

The Broncos (5-23): Santa Clara faces Northern Iowa at home before heading to Sacramento, Calif., for the tournament. Angela Kabanuck has eight doubles, six home runs and 10 RBIs to lead the Broncos offensively, sporting a .418 batting average. Jackie Morales holds a 3.39 ERA and has a 2-5 record in the circle. Santa Clara finished third in the Pacific Coast Softball Conference with a 24-34 overall record and a 11-9 league record.

The Spartans (10-10): Mercer wraps up its trip to the West Coast with a doubleheader at San Jose State. The Spartans face Northern Colorado in back-to-back doubleheaders Thursday and Friday before facing the Bears on Monday. Sarah Smith and Brittany McConnell lead the Spartans offensively with batting averages of .357 and .354, respectively. Roxanne Bejarano is the dominant force for SJSU in the circle with a 1.72 ERA and a 7-4 record. The Spartans finished second in the Western Athletic Conference with a 23-27 overall record and an 11-6 record in the league.

Conference Leaders: As a team, Mercer is fourth in the A-Sun in team batting average at .289. Junior Jamie Madruga leads the league with a .478 batting average and Ashley Anderson (.361) ranks ninth in the same category. Madruga is also ranked in the top 10 in eight other categories: first in on-base percentage (.532), second in slugging percentage (.881), fourth in home runs (six), fourth in RBIs (24), tied for fourth in doubles (nine), tied for fifth in total bases (59), sixth in runs scored (20), and tied for ninth in hits (32). Freshmen Holly Oglesbee and Jena Ellis also have rankings in the A-Sun. Oglesbee is fifth with 21 runs scored and Ellis is ninth with nine stolen bases. C.J.

Martin leads the conference with 18 walks and is second with a .530 on-base percentage. Anderson also holds the seventh spot with a .451 on-base percentage. Ace April Cunningham ranks eighth with 43 strikeouts. **Note:** Through games as of March 14.

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer record books for games started and is 36 starts away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started in 21 games this season. Bretscher took over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229. C.J. Martin and Kristin Talamantes both have 171 games started and are two starts away from entering the top five in the record books.

Junior Jamie Madruga is currently tied for fourth in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted six home runs this season, tying Nikki Bowey (2000-03) for the fourth-place spot. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already knocked in 24 runs this season. The third-place spot is held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03) with 108 RBIs.

Stiff Competition: The Bears faced their first ranked opponent last weekend in the USF adidas Invitational, falling 1-0 to No. 25 N.C. State. In the latest ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, two other Bear opponents are ranked in the top 25, with Alabama second and Georgia 19th. N.C. State fell out of the top 25 but still received votes.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
