Up Next: The Bears head to the A-Sun Conference Championships May 10-12 in DeLand, Fla. Mercer is the sixth seed and faces No. 1 seed Stetson in the first round. If the Bears beat the Hatters, they will face the loser of the ETSU/Lipscomb game at 8 p.m. If Mercer falls to Stetson in game one, it will take on the loser of the Gardner-Webb/Campbell game at 4 p.m.

The Hatters (39-19, 13-5 A-Sun): Stetson enters the conference tournament as the No. 1 seed after finishing the regular season behind Kennesaw State in the standings. The Hatters have lost their last two games, splitting with North Florida and dropping a single game against Florida Atlantic.

Stetson's pitching staff tops the league with a 1.83 ERA. Erica Demers leads the Hatters and the Atlantic Sun with a 1.75 ERA and a 17-5 record. Heather Colding is right behind her with a 1.76 ERA and 13-10 mark, ranking second in the league. The duo has both struck out over 100 batters; Demers with 119 and Colding with 108. Amanda Lindsey rounds out the Hatters' pitching staff and ranks fifth in the league with a 1.96 ERA and a 9-4 record.

Sherrrel Fountain paces the Hatters' offense, hitting .373 with 66 hits, three

triples and 17 RBIs. The senior ranks fifth in the A-Sun in batting average and fourth in stolen bases (25). Lindsay Wightman and Andrea Migliori are tied for second on the team with a .345 average. Migliori leads the team with 12 doubles, 14 home runs and 50 RBIs.

The Coach: Frank Griffin is in his 11th year as head coach of the Stetson softball team. In his 17 seasons as a head coach, Griffin has compiled a 579-290 career record for a .666 winning percentage, including a 354-203 record and .636 winning percentage in his tenure as a Hatter. Last season Stetson earned its seventh straight conference championship appearance, going in as a first seed in the 2006 A-Sun Conference Championship after posting a school-record 16 regular season league wins.

Last Meeting: The Bears and Hatters met in Mercer's conference-opening weekend in Macon. Stetson took the doubleheader, 7-3 and 6-1, over Mercer. C.J. Martin led the offensive attack in the first game for the Bears, going 2-for-4 at the plate with an RBI and run scored. In the second game, Jamie Madruga scored the Bears' only run with a solo shot in the sixth.

Last Outing: The Bears ended their regular-season with a 4-1 loss to No. 19 Georgia Tech. Mercer scored its only run of the game with a seventh-inning home run by Jamie Madruga. Stephanie Rossman tossed three innings and gave up two runs to take the loss.

Postseason Honors: Jamie Madruga garnered second-team all-conference honors for the season. The junior led the team offensively throughout the season and finished the regular season with a .389 batting average. Madruga has earned postseason honors in all three years as a Bear. She earned first-team honors last season and all-freshman accolades in 2005. She was also named to the all-tournament team after her play in the conference championships last year.

Slow Start: After starting 0-4 in A-Sun play, the Bears won seven of their last 14 conference games. The wins include a split with regular-season champions Kennesaw State and a sweep of Jacksonville.

Perfection: Jamie Madruga had two perfect games during the season, both being conference contests. The junior went 4-for-4 with a home run in the Bears' win against Belmont and was 3-for-3 with a double as Mercer fell to Lipscomb.

Freshman Power: The Bears' freshmen proved they can handle the pressure during the season as two different freshman have come through with game-winning hits. Laura Persons had a walk-off RBI-single to lead Mercer to a 7-6 victory over Belmont and knocked in the game-winning run with a double against Lipscomb for a 5-4 victory. Jena Ellis registered a two-run double to put the Bears ahead of A-Sun leader Kennesaw State for the 3-1 win.

Conference Leaders: Junior Jamie Madruga finished the regular season ranked second overall in the league with

a .389 batting average. She also ranks in the top 10 in nine other categories: first in slugging percentage (.765) and home runs (15), second in on-base percentage (.477) and total bases (124), tied for second in doubles (16), fourth in runs scored (43), tied for fifth in walks (27), tied for seventh in RBIs (42), and tied for ninth in hits (63).

Kelley Bretscher is third in the A-Sun with 20 sacrifice hits and tied for ninth with 24 walks. C.J. Martin is also ranked in walks, holding eighth with 25 walks. Freshman Jena Ellis is tied for ninth in the league with 14 stolen bases. and Stephanie Rossman holds seventh place in strikeouts with 117.

National Numbers: Through games as of April 29, two Bears rank nationally. Jamie Madruga is 36th in the NCAA in slugging percentage (.748) and Kelley Bretscher ranks 17th in sacrifice hits per game (.36).

Making History: Senior Kelley Bretscher recently set the Mercer all-time record for games started with 230. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started 57 this season. Bretscher took over Crystal Pardue (2001-04), who held the record with 229 starts.

Record Chasers: C.J. Martin and Kristin Talamantes are tied for third in games started with 205 starts. Second place is held by Crystal Pardue (2001-04) with 229 starts. Kelley Bretscher is just a run away from tying for fourth in runs scored. She now totals 103 in her career and is just one run away from Stacy Nagel (2000-03) with 104 runs scored.

Jamie Madruga holds third place in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted 15 home runs this season. Meghan Clark (2003-05) holds second place with 38 home runs. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already

knocked in 42 runs this season. Nikki Bowey (2000-03) holds the third-place spot with 108 RBIs. Madruga is just two doubles away from taking over the second-place spot for doubles. She currently has 31 career doubles and is looking to pass Meghan Clark (2003-05), who has 33 doubles.

Senior Stephanie Rossman took over second place in the record book for strikeouts a couple of weeks ago. Rossman has now retired 276 batters in her career and leads the team this season. First place is held by Katie Rosentreter (2003-06) with 722 strikeouts.

Stiff Competition: The Bears have faced three nationally ranked opponents this season, falling to No. 25 N.C. State, 1-0, at the USF adidas Invitational earlier this season, dropping a 9-0 decision to No. 2 Alabama in April and falling 4-1 to No. 19 Georgia Tech last week.

Tournament Appearances: The Bears entered the 2006 conference tournament as the No. 4 seed. Mercer dropped its first game to third-seeded Campbell, 2-0, and fell to the first seed, Stetson, in the second game by a score of 6-1.

The last time the Bears took a win in the tournament was in 2004 with a 5-1 victory over Gardner-Webb. Mercer fell in the first game of the tournament to No. 2 UCF and was eliminated in the third game with an 8-0 shutout by fourth-seeded Stetson. Three of Mercer's seniors were a part of that squad; Kelley Bretscher, Kristin Talamantes and C.J. Martin.

Mercer vs. Conference Opponents

The Camels (27-38-1, 8-10 A-Sun): Mercer opened conference play with a doubleheader against Campbell at home. The Camels held the Bears scoreless in the first game to take the 2-0 win and prevailed in the nightcap for a 4-2 victory.

The Bears recorded three hits throughout the first game with one each coming from Kelley Bretscher, C.J. Martin and Crystal Condra. Mercer was unable to capitalize on its hits and left seven runners stranded on base. Stephanie Rossman pitched the complete game for the Bears, striking out five and walking two. Lauren Caviness took the win for the Camels, striking out eight and walking two.

In the nightcap, the Camels took the lead in the fourth inning, scoring three runs. Campbell used two squeeze bunts to put its first two runs on the board and benefited on a throwing error by Haley Tallent to round out their scoring for the inning. The Camels added another run in the fifth inning with a solo shot by Quinn. The Bears got on the board late in the game with a sixth-inning two-run homer by Jamie Madruga. Sophomore April Cunningham took the loss for the Bears, giving up one earned run in four innings of work. Caviness earned her second win of the day, pitching the complete game with eight strikeouts and four walks.

The Lady Bisons (25-26-1, 9-8-1 A-Sun): The Bears grabbed their first conference victory with a split against Lipscomb in Nashville. Mercer dropped the first game, 10-1, but came back to earn a 5-4 victory in the second.

In the first game, Mercer got on the board early, scoring a run in the second inning on a sacrifice fly by Stacey Condra to plate C.J. Martin. The Lady Bisons used 11 hits, including five home runs, to take the convincing win. Madruga paced the offense for the Bears, going a perfect 3-for-3 at the plate with a double and two singles. Stephanie Rossman took the loss for the Bears, pitching the full game with five strikeouts. Campbell tossed the complete game, giving up four hits with five strikeouts.

In game two, Ashley Anderson and Laura Persons led the Bears offensively, both going 2-for-3 at the plate. Bylak earned her third win of the season, throwing the complete game and striking

out four with no walks. Christy Grisham took the loss for Lipscomb, pitching the first two and two-thirds innings and giving up four earned runs. Christen Campbell relieved for Grisham, giving up no runs with three strikeouts in the final four and one-third innings.

The Bucs (25-27, 10-8 A-Sun): Mercer used a split at ETSU to clinch a berth to the A-Sun Championship, taking game one, 4-3, in nine innings. The Bears fell in the second game, 8-0.

In the first game, Mercer scored first with a RBI-single by Kristin Talamantes in the third inning. Ashley Anderson had a two-run double in the fifth to give the Bears a 3-0 lead over the Bucs. Mercer starter Stephanie Rossman pitched a perfect game going into the fifth, but it was broken up by Briana Knight's double. ETSU evened the score by the seventh inning to push it into extra innings. In the top of the ninth, Talamantes drew the lead-off walk and advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt by Anderson. A ground-out by C.J. Martin allowed Talamantes to move to third, bringing Crystal Condra to the batter's box. The junior sealed the deal for the Bears with a single to right field to bring Talamantes home and give Mercer the lead. The Bucs were scoreless in the bottom of the frame, giving the Bears the win.

In game two, ETSU shut out Mercer in five innings. Each player on the Bears' roster saw action in the contest. The Bears recorded three hits throughout the game, one each from Talamantes, Jena Ellis and Laura Persons. Nikki Bylak took the loss for the game, giving up three runs in 2 and 1/3 innings of work. Darci Gilbert earned the complete-game shutout for the Bucs, striking out one and walking one.

The Bulldogs (32-24-1, 10-8 A-Sun): Mercer rounded out its conference schedule with a split at Gardner-Webb. The Bears took the first game, 4-2, and fell in the second game, 3-2.

Ashley Anderson drove in the first run for the Bears in game one with a single down the right field line to drive in Jamie Madruga. Anderson scored two batters later on a fielder's choice by Crystal Condra, giving the Bears a 2-0 lead in the

fourth inning. Madruga belted a two-run homer in the fifth to put the Bears up 4-0. The Bulldogs were scoreless throughout the game until their final at-bat. Melody Harrell led off the inning with a single up the middle and scored four batters later on a single by Mandy Ward. With the bases loaded and two outs, Kelly Linsley hit an infield-single to plate Lindsay Cox, who was in to run for Ward. Madruga paced the Bears' offense, scoring two runs with two RBIs while going 2-for-4 at the plate. Kelley Bretscher also had a solid game for Mercer, scoring a run while going 2-for-3. Senior Stephanie Rossman earned the complete-game win, striking out three and giving up no walks. Taryn Beck took the loss for the Bulldogs, giving up four runs and striking out five.

Mercer took the early lead in the second game, plating a run in the first and third innings. In the opening frame, Anderson knocked single through the right side to plate Madruga to put the Bears on the board. Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
