Up Next: Mercer opens Atlantic Sun action Friday, taking on Campbell at Sikes Field at 5 p.m. The Bears continue action Saturday as they host Stetson at 3 p.m.

The Camels (21-27-1, 3-5 A-Sun): Campbell and Mercer have faced one common opponent. The Camels opened their season with a win over Furman, 5-3, and tied 3-3 in the second game. The Bears faced Furman at the Panther Invitational and fell 15-7. Entering the week, Campbell ranks fourth in team pitching and seventh in batting.

Shayla Cullum and Jessica Huffman pace the Camel offense, Cullum batting

.364 with Huffman batting .355. Huffman was named the first Player-of-the-Week this season on Feb. 12 and leads the league in runs scored with 39 and stolen bases with 34. She is also tied for first with Cullum in hits (55) and is second in total bases (88) and doubles (14). Junior Lauren Caviness dominates the circle for the Camels with a 2.09 ERA and a 10-14 ERA. Caviness garnered Pitcher-of-the-Week honors on Feb. 19 and is second in the A-Sun with 143 strikeouts and third with five shutouts.

Drew Peterson is in his seventh season at the helm of the Camels and holds a 159-185 record in his six years. Peterson was named the A-Sun Coach of the Year last season after leading the Camels to a 31-28 record overall and a 12-8 conference record.

The Hatters (30-14, 4-2 A-Sun): Stetson travels to Kennesaw State Friday before facing the Bears Saturday at Sikes Field. The Bears and Hatters have both faced Iowa this season. Mercer dropped a 13-6 decision to Iowa at the Capital Classic in California. Stetson split with Iowa in its first tournament of the season, taking the 5-3 win in the first game and falling 4-1 in the second.

Sherrrel Fountain paces the Hatter offense, averaging .358 at the plate. The senior is ranked ninth in individual batting average in the A-Sun and is second in on-base percentage (.468). The Hatters split their pitching duties between three pitchers, with all three of

them with ERAs below 2.00. Erica Demers, the preseason A-Sun Pitcher-of-the-Year, leads Stetson with a 1.61 ERA and sports a 12-4 record. Heather Colding and Amanda Lindsey are close behind with 1.70 and 1.78 ERAs, respectively. As a team, the Hatters lead the conference in pitching and are second in fielding and fourth in batting.

Frank Griffin is in his 11th season at the helm of the program, posting a 354-203 record in his first 10 seasons and leading the Hatters to a regular-season championship in 2006.

Conference Openers: The Bears are looking to continue what they started last year when they opened their 2006 conference schedule at home last year, sweeping Jacksonville, 5-0 and 4-1.

Last Time Out: With more than a week off, the Bears are looking to rebound from a doubleheader sweep by South Alabama. USA took the first game convincingly, defeating the Bears 7-2. The second game was a pitcher's duel with just five hits combined for both teams, and the Jaguars prevailed with a 2-0 win. Senior Stephanie Rossman struck out six in the first game and 12 in the nightcap.

Conference Leaders: As a team, Mercer ranks eighth in the A-Sun in team batting average at .251.

Junior Jamie Madruga leads the league with a .419 batting average and ranks in the top 10 in eight other categories: first in slugging percentage (.800) and on-base percentage (.479), tied for second in home runs (nine), tied for third in doubles (13), third in total bases (84), tied for sixth in RBIs (36), and tied for seventh in runs scored (27) and tied for eighth in hits (44).

Freshmen Holly Oglesbee and Jena Ellis also have rankings in the A-Sun. Oglesbee is tied for fifth with 29 runs scored and Ellis is tied for ninth with 11 stolen bases. C.J. Martin is tied for fourth in the league with 20 walks and is sixth in on-base percentage (.444) and Kelley Bretscher ranks

third with 13 sacrifice bunts.

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer record books for games started and is 22 starts away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started in 35 this season. Bretscher took over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229. C.J. Martin and Kristin Talamantes are tied for third in the same category with 183 starts.

Junior Jamie Madruga took over third place in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted nine home runs this season. Meghan Clark (2003-05) holds second place with 38 home runs. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already knocked in 30 runs this season. The third-place spot is held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03) with 108 RBIs. After the weekend in California, Madruga also moved into the record books for career doubles, tying Kerri Ryskamp (2004-05) for fifth place with 28 doubles. Stacy Nagel (2000-03) holds fourth with 29 doubles.

Stiff Competition: In the latest ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, one Bear opponent is ranked in the top 25 with Alabama third. Two other opponents received votes; Georgia and N.C. State. The Bears fell to N.C. State, 1-0, at the USF adidas Invitational earlier this season.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
