Home Finale: The Bears conclude their home schedule Wednesday, April 25, with a doubleheader against in-state Atlantic Sun foe Kennesaw State. Four seniors will be honored for their time at Mercer as they play their final games at Sikes Field; Kelley Bretscher, C.J. Martin, Stephanie Rossman and Kristin Talamantes.

The Owls (39-17, 13-3 A-Sun): League-leaders Kennesaw State travel to Macon to take on the Bears in the A-Sun Series of the Week. The series is an important one for both teams, as Mercer continues to look for a berth to the conference tournament and

Kennesaw State looks to clinch the regular-season conference championship title. KSU has lost just three A-Sun contests this season, splitting in doubleheaders with ETSU, Belmont and Gardner-Webb. The Owls are entering Wednesday's contest on a four-game winning streak, sweeping Jacksonville and North Florida last weekend..

Senior Keri McKee paces the Owls offense and joins Mercer's Jamie Madruga as the only other player in the A-Sun hitting over .400. The Preseason Player of the Year is averaging .408 at the plate with a league high 69 hits and 19 doubles. Brittany Matthews leads the team in the circle, sporting a 20-4 record with a 2.01 ERA. The junior garnered A-Sun Co-Pitcher of the Week honors this past week and is on top of the conference with 215 strikeouts, nine shutouts and a .177 opponent batting average. KSU ranks third in the A-Sun in team pitching with an average ERA of 2.39 and has no one on the staff with an ERA over 4.00.

The Coach: Scott Whitlock is in his 17th season at the helm of the program, boasting a 773-163 record in his first 16 years. After successful runs at the NAIA and NCAA Division II levels, Whitlock enjoyed success in his first Division I season as he guided Kennesaw State to a 38-17 record and a second-place finish in the Atlantic Sun Conference while also being named A-Sun Co-Coach of the Year.

Last Outing: Mercer earned its first conference sweep of the season Saturday, taking a doubleheader from Jacksonville. The Bears used a late rally in the first game to defeat the Dolphins, 3-2, and took the second game into extra innings, prevailing in the bottom of the ninth for a 7-6 victory.

In the Clutch: Laura Persons proved once again to be a clutch player, knocking in the game-winning run against Belmont in the bottom of the ninth. The freshman used her skills last weekend to push the Bears ahead of Lipscomb with an RBI-double to plate the winning run.

Conference Leaders: Junior Jamie Madruga is ranked second overall in the league with a .401 batting average and ranks in the top 10 in nine other categories: first in slugging percentage (.782), tied for first in total bases (111) and home runs (13), second in on-base percentage (.488), tied for third in doubles (15), fifth in runs scored (38), tied for sixth in walks (25), eighth in RBIs (38), and ninth in hits (57).

C.J. Martin is tied for sixth with 25 walks and Kelley Bretscher is third with 17 sacrifice hits. Freshman Jena Ellis is tenth in the league with 13 stolen bases.

Stephanie Rossman moved up in the rankings after the weekend at home, now holding seventh place in strikeouts with 101.

National Numbers: Through games as of April 15, two Bears rank nationally. Jamie Madruga holds three rankings: 21st in slugging percentage (.811), 28th in doubles per game (.33) and 40th in batting average (.424). Kelley Bretscher ranks 15th in sacrifice hits per game (.38).

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer record books for games started and is seven starts away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started in 50

this season. Bretscher took over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229. C.J. Martin and Kristin Talamantes are tied for third in the same category with 198 starts. Bretscher also moved into fourth place for runs scored, now totaling 101 in her career. Third place is held by Stacy Nagel (2000-03) with 104 runs scored.

Junior Jamie Madruga holds third place in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted 13 home runs this season. Meghan Clark (2003-05) holds second place with 38 home runs. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already knocked in 38 runs this season. The third-place spot is held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03) with 108 RBIs. After knocking a double against Lipscomb, Madruga took over sole possession of third place for career doubles with 30. Second-place is held by Meghan Clark (2003-05) with 33 doubles.

Senior Stephanie Rossman took over second place in the record book for strikeouts after the weekend at home. Rossman has now retired 256 batters in her career and leads the team this season. First place is held by Katie Rosentreter (2003-06) with 722 strikeouts.

Stiff Competition: The Bears have faced two nationally ranked opponents this season, falling to No. 25 N.C. State, 1-0, at the USF adidas Invitational earlier this season, and dropping a 9-0 decision to No. 2 Alabama earlier this week.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
