On the Road: After returning home from Nashville, the Bears travel to Oxford, Ala., for a match-up against No. 3 Alabama Tuesday at 7:30 p.m. EST in Oxford, Ala.

The Crimson Tide (42-4): Mercer faces its highest ranked opponent of the season, taking on Alabama, which ranks third in the ESPN/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll. The Crimson Tide ranks second on the Eastern Division of the Southeastern Conference behind LSU, dropping just four games in the league so far. Alabama had the weekend off, with its last action against Chattanooga at home last Wednesday in a doubleheader. The

Crimson Tide defeated the Lady Mocs in both games, 8-6 and 8-1. The Bears faced UTC earlier this season at the USF adidas Invitational and fell to the Lady Mocs, 9-1. Alabama ranks second in the SEC with a .334 batting average, led by sophomore transfer Lauren Parker with a .461 average. Sophomore Brittany Rogers, a 2006 NFCA All-American and Easton-Bell Sports All-American as a freshman, is also hitting over .400. The Crimson Tide also has six other players averaging over .300 at the plate. Chrissy Owens dominates the circle for Alabama, sporting a 20-2 record with a .97 ERA. The junior was named to the second team NFCA All-South Region last season and was an All-SEC Freshman.

The Coach: Head coach Patrick Murphy is in his ninth season at the helm of the program, sporting a 412-139 record in his first eight seasons. In his eight seasons with the Crimson Tide, Murphy has guided Alabama to eight consecutive NCAA tournaments, including appearances in four Women's College World Series. In 2006, Murphy and his staff were named the NFCA South Region Coaching Staff of the Year for the third time after leading Alabama to its first Southeastern Conference Championship and a trip to the Women's College World Series. The team finished with a 54-11 record and a 25-4 record in the SEC. Murphy is also ranked among the top 10 for Winningest Active Coaches by Percentage, ranking eighth with a .735 career percentage.

Last Time Out: The Bears picked up their first conference wins of the season, splitting in the doubleheaders against Lipscomb and Belmont in Nashville. Mercer dropped the first game of the twinbill against the Lady Bisons, 10-1, but fought back in the second game to take the 5-4 win. The Bears took the first game of the doubleheader against the Bruins, 5-4, but fell in the second game, 9-6. Jamie Madruga led the Bears during the weekend, batting .583 and scoring five runs with a double and a home run.

Hot at the Plate: Jamie Madruga had two perfect games for the weekend, going 3-for-3 with a double in the loss against Lipscomb and 4-for-4 with a home run in the win against Belmont. The junior continues to hold the top spot in the conference for individual batting average with a .424 average and is also leading the league in slugging percentage and total bases. The Warner Robins, Ga., native is looking to become the first Bear to lead the A-Sun in average since Kristi Hopkins hit a league-leading .419 in 2000.

Conference Leaders: Junior Jamie Madruga leads the league with a .424 batting average and ranks in the top 10 in eight other categories: first in slugging percentage (.811), total bases (107) and on-base percentage (.494), tied for second in home runs (12) and doubles (15), fifth in runs scored (34), sixth in hits (56), and tied for seventh in RBIs (35).

C.J. Martin is tied for fifth with 25 walks and Kelley Bretscher is third with 17 sacrifice hits. Freshman Jena Ellis is tenth in the league with 13 stolen bases.

Stephanie Rossman moved up in the rankings after the weekend in Nashville, now holding the ninth-place spot in strikeouts with 83.

National Numbers: Through games as of April 11, two Bears rank nationally in the NCAA. Kelley Bretscher ranks 15th in sacrifice hits per game (.36) and Jamie Madruga ranks 19th in slugging percentage (.809).

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer record books for games started and is 12 starts

away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started in 45 this season. Bretscher took over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229. C.J. Martin and Kristin Talamantes are tied for third in the same category with 193 starts. Bretscher also moved into fourth place for runs scored, now totaling 100 in her career. Third place is held by Stacy Nagel (2000-03) with 104 runs scored.

Junior Jamie Madruga holds third place in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted 12 home runs this season. Meghan Clark (2003-05) holds second place with 38 home runs. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already knocked in 35 runs this season. The third-place spot is held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03) with 108 RBIs. After knocking a double against Lipscomb, Madruga took over sole possession of third place for career doubles with 30. Second-place is held by Meghan Clark (2003-05) with 33 doubles.

Senior Stephanie Rossman is climbing her way up the record books, taking over fourth in strikeouts with 238. Third place is held by Kristi Montgomery (2000-03) with 250 strikeouts.

Stiff Competition: In the latest ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, one Bear opponent is ranked in the top 25 with Alabama third. N.C. State also received votes. The Bears fell to N.C. State, 1-0, at the USF adidas Invitational earlier this season.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
