Home Sweet Home: The Bears continue their 13-game home stretch as they face South Alabama in a mid-week contest Wednesday, March 27, at 5 p.m. at Sikes Field.

The Jaguars (20-11): The South Alabama softball team is in its inaugural season, and holds a winning record entering Wednesday's doubleheader. Sophomore Tara Donaldson anchors South Alabama's offense, hitting .429 on the season with 11 doubles and 30 RBIs. Four other Jaguars are averaging over .300 and three more above .250. USA averages .310 as a team at the plate. Defensively, Linden Jones

dominates the circle for the Jaguars with a 1.60 ERA and a 13-6 record. The senior has struck out 131 batters and held her opponents to a .171 batting average.

The Bears and Jaguars have faced two common opponents, Alabama State and Villanova. Mercer fell to ASU in its season-opening doubleheader, 7-1 and 5-4. South Alabama has won all three games against Alabama State, defeating the Hornets 10-0, 6-0 and 6-4. The Bears faced Villanova as the USF adidas Invitational, falling in a 6-3 decision. USA took on Villanova at the Altamonte Springs tournament in Florida, defeating the Wildcats 8-0. South Alabama has also faced three Atlantic Sun members. The Jaguars split with Belmont, defeating them 12-0 and falling 9-8 in the second game. USA also defeated Stetson, 7-2, and Kennesaw State, 7-3.

The Coach: Becky Clark is the first coach for the Jaguars, heading the first-year program after three seasons at the University of Mobile. There, she led the 2005 team to a 51-13 record and their second consecutive fourth place finish at the NAIA National Tournament. Overall, Clark led Mobile to a 156-33-1 record and three national tournament appearances including a national runner-up finish in 2003.

Clark, who started her collegiate career at Troy University in Troy, Ala., and then transferred to the University of Mobile, graduated cum laude in 1995 with a B.A. in English and a Marketing minor. In 1999, she earned an M.A. in Education, and graduated with honors and a 4.0 G.P.A. Among her many accomplishments, Clark was twice named Academic All-American in 1993 and 1994. She was also a member of the NAIA Regional Coaching Staff of the Year in 1998.

Doubleheaders: Even though they have played 34 games this season, the doubleheader against USA is only the Bears' sixth of the season. While participating in doubleheaders, Jamie Madruga leads the Bears with a .500 average. The junior has recorded 15 hits and 13 RBIs with a .900 slugging percentage in the Bears' five doubleheaders.

Conference Leaders: As a team, Mercer is sixth in the A-Sun in team batting average at .257. Junior Jamie Madruga leads the league with a .430 batting average and ranks in the top 10 in eight other categories: first in slugging percentage (.800), second in on-base percentage (.487) and doubles (13), third in total bases (80), tied for fourth in RBIs (29) and home runs (8), and tied for sixth in hits (43) and runs scored (26). Freshmen Holly Oglesbee and Jena Ellis also have rankings in the A-Sun. Oglesbee is fourth with 28 runs scored and Ellis is seventh with 11 stolen bases. C.J. Martin is second in the league with 20 walks.

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer record books for games started and is 24 starts away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started in 33 this season. Bretscher took

over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229. After last weekend, C.J. Martin took over third place in the same category with 183 starts. Kristin Talamantes has started in 181 games, holding fourth-place in the record books.

Junior Jamie Madruga is now tied for third place in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted eight home runs this season tying with Kerri Ryskamp (2004-05). Meghan Clark (2003-05) holds second place with 38 home runs. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already knocked in 29 runs this season. The third-place spot is held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03) with 108 RBIs. After the weekend in California, Madruga also moved into the record books for career doubles, tying Kerri Ryskamp (2004-05) for fifth place with 28 doubles. Stacy Nagel (2000-03) holds fourth with 29 doubles.

Stiff Competition: In the latest ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, one Bear opponent is ranked in the top 25, with Alabama fourth. Two other opponents received votes; Georgia and N.C. State. The Bears fell to N.C. State, 1-0, at the USF adidas Invitational earlier this season.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
