Up Next: The Bears host Georgia in a mid-week doubleheader at Sikes Field Wednesday, April 11. First pitch is scheduled for 4 p.m.

The Bulldogs (31-19): Georgia enters Wednesday's contest after coming off a three-game sweep by No. 1 Tennessee at home. The Bears and Bulldogs have faced several common opponents, most recently Atlantic Sun member Campbell. UGA defeated Campbell in late March in Athens, 2-0 and 2-1, while the Bears fell to the Camels, 2-0 and 4-2. The Bulldogs average .276 as a team, led by senior Kellie Middleton with a .383 aver-

age. A 2006 First Team All-SEC selection and Louisville Slugger/NFCA Second Team All-American, Middleton leads the team with a .604 slugging percentage, 31 RBIs and 36 stolen bases. Charvi Greer is the only other Bulldog over .300 with a .366 average. Kasi Carroll dominates the circle with a 19-5 record and a 1.76 ERA. Carroll, a 2006 All-SEC selection, has given up just 35 earned runs in 139 innings of work and struck out 145 batters.

The Coach: Lu Harris-Champer is in her seventh season with the Bulldogs, posting a 313-104 record in her first six seasons with five consecutive NCAA tournament appearances and two SEC Championships. Harris-Champer and the Bulldogs captured their third Southeastern Conference Eastern Division title en route to posting its fifth consecutive season of 54 or more wins in 2006. Overall, UGA tallied a 54-15 overall record and earned a berth in the NCAA Regionals. Harris-Champer went to Athens after leading Southern Mississippi to back-to-back appearances in the Women's College World Series in 1999 and 2000.

Last Meeting: Georgia and Mercer met last season in Athens where the Bulldogs swept the Bears, 5-0 and 8-5. Kelley Bretscher led the Bears during the doubleheader, going 4-for-7 with a double.

Last Time Out: The Bears started conference action last weekend at home, falling to Campbell Friday and Stetson Saturday. Campbell shut out the Bears in the first game, 2-0. Jamie Madruga belted a two-run homer, her tenth home run of the season, in the nightcap but the Bears were unable to take the win and fell to Campbell, 4-2. On Saturday, Mercer fell to Stetson, 7-3, in the first game. Senior C.J. Martin led the offense for the Bears, scoring a run and driving in one while going 2-for-4 at the plate. Madruga blasted her second home run of the weekend as the Bears fell in the second game, 6-1.

Hot at the Plate: Junior Crystal Condra is currently on the longest hitting streak for the Bears, notching at least one hit in the last four games. The four-game hitting streak is the longest one Condra has had this season.

Conference Leaders: Junior Jamie Madruga leads the league with a .409 batting average and ranks in the top 10 in seven other categories: first in slugging percentage (.809) and on-base percentage (.474), tied for first in home runs (11), tied for second in total bases (93), tied for fourth in doubles (13), and tied for sixth in runs scored (29) and seventh in RBIs (33).

C.J. Martin also holds two rankings, tying for fifth in walks (21) and ranking sixth in on-base percentage (.430). Holly Oglesbee is tied with Madruga with 29 runs scored and Kelley Bretscher ranks third with 14 sacrifice bunts.

Mercer ranks ninth in both team batting (.243 average) and team pitching (6.17 ERA) in the league, topping Belmont in both categories.

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer record books for games started and is 18 starts away from taking over the record. She started off the year with

173 games started and has started in 39 this season. Bretscher took over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229. C.J. Martin and Kristin Talamantes are tied for third in the same category with 187 starts. Bretscher also moved into fourth place for runs scored, now totaling 96 in her career. Third place is held by Stacy Nagel (2000-03) with 104 runs scored.

Junior Jamie Madruga holds third place in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs and has already belted 11 home runs this season. Meghan Clark (2003-05) holds second place with 38 home runs. Madruga also moved into fourth in the record books in career RBIs. She started the season with 49 and has already knocked in 33 runs this season. The third-place spot is held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03) with 108 RBIs. Madruga also moved into the record books for career doubles, tying Kerri Ryskamp (2004-05) for fifth place with 28 doubles. Stacy Nagel (2000-03) and Erin Jalbert (1998-01) are tied for fourth with 29 doubles.

Stiff Competition: In the latest ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, one Bear opponent is ranked in the top 25 with Alabama third. N.C. State also received votes. The Bears fell to N.C. State, 1-0, at the USF adidas Invitational earlier this season.

INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
