Back at it: After having a full week to practice without any games, the Bears return to the field to continue their eight-game home stretch as they host Savannah State. The doubleheader is scheduled for 2 p.m.

The Lady Tigers (1-8): Savannah State started its season off on a seven-game losing streak and earned its first win of the season Monday against NAIA Goshen College. The Lady Tigers took the first game, 9-2, and dropped a 7-3 decision in the second game. SSU faced Atlantic Sun Conference member Lipscomb in late February, falling to the Lady Bisons, 10-1 and 20-0. Junior

Ashley Pierce leads the Lady Tigers offensively with a .409 batting average. Pierce has recorded three doubles and three RBIs on the season. In the Lady Tigers' win against Goshen, Pierce went 5-for-5, scoring a run and knocking in two. Sophomore Jazmine Reynolds is also an offensive threat for the Lady Tigers. Reynolds averages .300 at the plate and has hit a team-high two triples this season. The only senior on the 14-man roster, Krystal Palmer has pitched every game for SSU. She has given up 68 earned runs in 45.2 innings, striking out eight. The Lady Tigers take on NAIA Edward Waters Friday in Jacksonville, Fla., before traveling to Macon to take on the Bears.

The Coach: Henry Banks is in his first season as head coach at Savannah State. Banks is also the running backs coach for the Savannah State football team. Prior to SSU, Banks was the defensive coordinator on the Vail Middle School football team in Middletown, Ohio. Banks also coached football at Middletown High School where he was the linebackers coach from 1994-2000 and at McKinley High School from 1981-1994 where he served in the same capacity. Banks was a four-year letterwinner as a linebacker at Kentucky State University from 1977-1981. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education and recreation in 1984.

Last Meeting: The Bears defeated the Lady Tigers last season in a doubleheader at Sikes Field, 8-1 and 19-0. Kristin Talamantes led the Bears in the doubleheader as she went 7-for-8 at the plate, including two doubles and three RBIs.

Conference Leaders: As a team, Mercer is tied for second in the A-Sun in team batting average at .297. Junior Jamie Madruga is sixth in the league in individual batting average with a .436 and Kelley Bretscher (.414) ranks ninth in the same category. Madruga is also second in slugging percentage (.846) and tied for fourth with 14 RBIs. Freshman Holly Oglesbee is tied for fourth with 12 runs scored and Bretscher (10) is tied for eighth in the same category. C.J. Martin is second in walks (12) and on-base percentage (.550). Pitcher April Cunningham ranks in three pitching categories: tied for third in appearances (nine), seventh in strikeouts (26) and tenth in innings pitched (33.2).

Fresh Power: Freshman Stacey Condra led the Bears offensively during the Mercer Classic, going 5-for-10 in the tournament. The Suwanee, Ga., native knocked her first collegiate double during the game against Oakland and had three RBIs for the weekend.

Record Chasers: Senior Kelley Bretscher is now in second place in the Mercer career record books for games started and is 45 starts away from taking over the record. She started off the year with 173 games started and has started in 12 games this season. Bretscher took over second place, surpassing Meghan Clark (2003-05) at 179 games started, earlier this season. Crystal Pardue (2001-04) holds the record with 229.

Junior Jamie Madruga is currently fifth in the Mercer record books for home runs. She entered the season with 14 home runs, just six short of the fourth place spot held by Nikki Bowey (2000-03). Madruga has already belted four homers this season, needing two more to tie for the fourth-place spot and three to have sole possession of it.

Stiff Competition: In the latest ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, two of the Bears' opponents are ranked in the top 25 and one received votes. Alabama ranks the highest at third. Georgia holds the 23rd-place spots and N.C. State received votes.

Preseason All-Atlantic Sun: After earning All-Atlantic Sun First Team honors last season, junior first baseman Jamie Madruga was selected to the 2007 All-Atlantic Sun Preseason Team. The native of Warner Robins, Ga., finished the 2006 season ranked fourth in slugging percentage (.613) and sixth in batting average (.348) in the league.

Ranking Fourth: The Mercer softball team was picked to finish fourth in the Atlantic Sun Conference in the league's preseason poll voted upon by the coaches. Stetson received six first-place votes and 95 points to earn the first-place spot with Kennesaw State close behind with 93 points. Stetson, the defending regular-season champions, is also favored to win the tournament championship, which will be played on its home field May 10-12. Campbell earned 69 points for third place and the Bears finished one point behind the Camels to take fourth place. Behind Mercer were North Florida and ETSU in fifth and sixth with Gardner-Webb, Jacksonville, Lipscomb and Belmont rounding out the poll.

MIKE RAYNOR
INTERIM HEAD COACH
First Season ♦ Georgia Southern, 1974

Mike Raynor begins his first season as the interim head coach for the Mercer softball program. Raynor is the fifth head coach in school history, taking over a team that returns eight starters and finished with a 26-28 overall record and a 12-6 record in Atlantic Sun Conference play last season.

"We are extremely pleased that Mike has accepted the head softball position," said Pope. "He knows our conference well since he has umpired in it for quite a few years. He is familiar with the talent level of the Mercer team and also with the teams in the Atlantic Sun Conference. Mike has enjoyed tremendous success with travel teams in the Atlanta area and I feel this will be a great advantage to him from a recruiting standpoint. We think he is a perfect fit."

Raynor has coached travel teams in Cobb County for the past 14 years, most recently serving as coach for the East Cobb Bullets Gold team. His teams won two national championships and five state championships. Last year, he also served as a community coach at Sequoyah High School, the 2006 AAAA State Champions.

Raynor has also served as a collegiate umpire for the past 15 years. Until recently, he served as the president of the Southeastern Collegiate Umpires Association, along with acting as the co-coordinator of umpires for the Atlantic Coast Conference and the coordinator of umpires for the Peach Belt Conference. He also served on umpire staffs with the Southeastern Conference, the Atlantic Sun Conference, the Southern Conference and Conference USA. In 2006, he umpired in the NCAA Division I Regional at Fresno State and has umpired in numerous NCAA conference championship tournaments. He was named the 2005 Official of the Year by the Georgia Athletic Officials Association.

In 1974, Raynor earned his bachelor's degree in education from Georgia Southern and went on to serve as the head baseball coach at Cook County High School. During his time at Cook County, he took over the responsibilities of Athletics Director and Head Football Coach.

"With the rich tradition and history at Mercer, I think we have an excellent opportunity to attract student-athletes to be strong competitors in the Atlantic Sun," said Raynor. "I am excited to be here and have the opportunity to build and expand the softball program."

A native of Fitzgerald, Ga., he and his wife, Brenda, have three daughters, Page, Molly, and Alison.
